



Decided by the Presidium of the Leopoldina, March 21st 2018

Good Scientific Practice applied in the Acta Historica Leopoldina (AHL) and Nova Acta Leopoldina (NAL)

The series of publications edited by the Leopoldina follow the principles of good scientific practice nationally and internationally codified in their various contexts. The Leopoldina is signatory of the IAC/IAP statement “Responsible Conduct in the Global Research Enterprise”, and thus follows its principles.

Authors, editors and peer reviewers of the Leopoldina’s publication series follow these principles in their contributions or their work on the series.

1 Transparent Publishing

The Leopoldina – institutional publisher of the series – acts responsibly and meets international standards when publishing the AHL and NAL. The Leopoldina follows the “Principles of Transparency and Best Practices in Scholarly Publishing” as well as the “Code of Conduct for Journal Publishers” of the Committee on Publication Ethics (COPE).

2 Editors

Editors assigned by the Leopoldina follow the COPE “Code of Conduct and Best Practice Guidelines for Journal Editors”.

3 Authors

Regarding authorship, the Leopoldina refers to the memorandum “Safeguarding Good Scientific Practice” defined by the German Research Foundation (DFG).

In their contributions to AHL and NAL, authors follow international standards and comply with the “International Standards for Authors” defined at the 2nd World Conference on Research Integrity.

4 Peer Reviewers

Peer reviewers assigned by the editors of AHL and NAL should respect confidentiality, and disclose bias and conflicts of interests (see DFG memorandum “Safeguarding Good Scientific Practice”, p. 84). The “COPE Ethical Guidelines for Peer Reviewers” provide assistance for AHL and NAL peer reviewers to act ethically.
